Lessons are typically 35 minutes long and charged in advance (fees below). With the agreement of parents or guardians and availability of suitable lesson times within the VMT's timetable, lessons can be of a shorter or longer duration to suit the student's needs.

The VMTs aim to deliver a minimum of 30 lessons spread evenly over the academic year. Students in public examination years are taught off timetable (e.g. before/after school, during break/lunch or during a study period); all other lessons rotate weekly.

To sign up for instrumental lessons, please complete a registration form at the online link below. Students are then added to our waiting list, and we will reach out to share availability (please keep in mind that demand is often high and waiting lists can be long). Please note, Lower School students with two or more co-curricular lessons a week may need to liaise with their class teachers and/or Lower School Head Karen before committing to additional lessons.

After students are allocated from the waiting list, the VMTs operate their own timetables and make arrangements for lessons directly with parents and students using Involve Education, a music management software for teachers, students and parents that collates all information, such as scheduling, timetables, lesson feedback and practice notes. Involve Education also sends reminders for upcoming lessons, as well as lesson feedback and practice notes via email.

LAMDA

Our LAMDA (London Academy of Music and Dramatic Art) teachers, **Tammy Cornish** and **Jacquelynn Poole**, offer lessons in both the Performance and Communications LAMDA syllabi, including Acting, Verse and Prose, Speaking in Public, Devising, Mime, and Musical Theatre. Students from Reception to Year 13 can take exams from Introductory to PCert. LAMDA grades 6-8 are also accredited with UCAS points.

Lessons are taught in 35-minute, fixed weekly sessions, either individually, in pairs, or in groups of up to four students. The aim is to spread sessions evenly throughout the academic year, and students in public examination years (11 & 13) are taught off-timetable. Instrumental lesson fees apply (see page 3).

OPPORTUNITIES TO PERFORM

Upper School

- The **Middle School** and **Senior School Shows** are highlights of the year. Last year, we staged *Sister Act Jr* and *The Ballad of Raggedy Alice*, a new musical created by KAS staff.
- Two annual concerts Axe Monsters for school bands and Unplugged for electro-accoustic music – showcase Upper School musicians. Both events provide the ideal preparation for students to perform at KAStonbury, the school's summer music festival.
- The Christmas and Spring Concerts showcase selected soloists and Upper School choirs and ensembles, and are arranged by the Director of Music.
- KAStonbury is a festival-style, whole-school celebration organised by KASparents. Information about this event will be published during the Spring Term.
- Termly Soloist Concerts showcase musicians who are experienced performers with repertoire prepared to a high standard. Students must be nominated by either a VMT (for students who learn at KAS) or a parent/guardian (for those who take lessons externally).
- Workshops are available for selected students in Lower and Upper Schools.
- ISTA (International Schools Theatre Association) Drama Residential Trips for Middle School and GCSE years.

Lower School

- Summer Term's Hammerhead concert for budding Lower School bands is typically held the day before KAStonbury.
- The Lower School Spring Concert showcases Lower School musicians.
- **Seasonal Songs Concerts** for the whole of Lower School in combined year groups.
- **Watford Festival** offers Year 6 Choir a unique opportunity to sing in a competition with other North London schools.
- **Peripatetic Concerts** are organised by students' instrumental and singing teachers.
- Big Sings, an event for infants.
- Lower School Callovers provide a weekly platform for children to practice performing in an informal and encouraging setting.











GRADED MUSIC EXAMS

KAS students can be entered for graded music exams, with the fees (detailed below) charged in arrears to the student's termly bill. For students who take lessons at the school, the VMT is responsible for consulting with parents or guardians and making the exam entry.

ABRSM

Practical graded music exams are offered to students from Grades 1 to 8, as well as a pre-Grade 1 Initial Grade for some instruments. These take place in person on the school site. There is usually one exam day each term (dependent on interest).

Music Theory exams at Grades 1 to 5 are delivered online and at Grades 6 to 8 as paper-based exams. Online exams are booked through the school and are sat externally, usually at home, outside of school hours.

Online **performance grade exams** are recorded exams, which are equivalent to practical grade exams. These can be recorded remotely and submitted at any time via the school. For students taking lessons at school, VMTs are responsible for rehearsing, recording and submitting performance grade exam recordings.

Please liaise with your child's VMT regarding specific exam arrangements.

Rockschool's exams in Electric Guitar, Acoustic Guitar, Bass, Drums, Vocals, Piano and Keyboard, and Music Production also equate to UCAS points.
