Collecting Your Results:

- **Hard Copies:** On results day, you may collect a physical copy of your Statement of Results, along with information about post-results services, at school during the designated times listed above.
- **Authorised Collection:** If you cannot collect your results in person, you can authorise a friend or relative to collect on your behalf. A signed authorisation letter is required in this case.
- **Electronic Delivery:** Your Statement of Results with final grades will also be sent electronically to your school email address after midday on results day.

Please Note:

- Results cannot be provided over the phone.
- These arrangements may be subject to change depending on circumstances. We will keep you informed of any updates.
- Staff members will be available on results day to answer questions and assist you.

Post Results Services

Details regarding the Review of Results (RoR) services will be included with your Statement of Results. Students must complete a consent form before any requests for a review can be submitted to the exam boards. Please contact the Exams Office for any queries.

How to Prepare for Results Day

It is results day, and you are probably picking up results to a formal exam for the first time so here are a few tips to help you get through the day:

Have a good breakfast and head down to school to collect your results.

Decide where you want to open your results

The results are your own and will be given to you in a sealed envelope. They will not be displayed publicly on the notice board.

You can decide where you want to open it, maybe nip outside to open it alone or rip it open in front of your friends. Everyone is different so there is no need to feel under pressure from your friends to open it in front of them.

It is best to be inside or around in school to open your results, so you can get advice from teaching staff if you need it.

We may also request that you pose for a photograph with your friends for the school publicity on the school website or local newspaper so be prepared. You can decline if you do not wish to be photographed on that day.

GCSE Grades and how much they matter

The grades you get at GCSE are a fantastic milestone to help you progress onto A-levels or further study.

If things do not go exactly as planned, try not to worry. Our staff will be on-site to help you explore your options, and your family are there to support you too. If you have secured your place at your chosen Sixth Form or College, focus on that achievement and look forward to the exciting next chapter ahead.

If you have narrowly missed the grade, you can consider applying for a review of marking. Remember the grades could go up or down after review. Information about this process and the consent slip with the necessary deadlines will be included in your results envelope.
